## **Orissa Refugee Update**

IREF continues to minister to and support about 70 Christian refugees who were forced to flee the state of Orissa last autumn. It has been estimated that 70,000 Christians were left homeless as a result of the persecution, in which 4,000 homes and 450 churches were destroyed. 3,000 people are still missing and 77 are known to have died in the troubles. A few Christians have returned home; but most of the 100 who initially found their way to Repalle have remained, as it is still not safe for them to return to rebuild their destroyed homes and churches. Many Christians have been required to renounce their faith as a condition of being allowed to return to their villages.

Communication with the refugees remains difficult, as they do not speak Telugu and only a few are fluent in English. The language barrier hinders their ability to find any work outside their home state. It is encouraging that some of the refugee children have begun attending school in Repalle and a few of the believers have found work with IREF.



The *Association of Rural Ministers* was recently formed under the auspices of IREF to meet some of

the challenges specific to ministers in rural settings, such as the persecution of Christians in Orissa.
