India 2016 team reports

A medical team from the UK has recently returned from India where they were present for IREF's annual Youth Conference. Here is some of their news, starting with two people for whom this was their first visit to India.



Lindsey Clark writes:

January 2016 held a lot of firsts for me - my first passport; my first flight; my first time in India; and my first visit to IREF, Repalle.

As a member of Airdrie Baptist Church, IREF has been on my radar for around 12 years. My family have sponsored children and we've prayed for each medical team that has gone out over those years.

Each time I wished that I had some kind of medical training so that I could help out and be part of the team, but I had resigned myself to the fact that I never would. So, when I was approached for this year's trip I jumped at the chance! What a blessing to see the compound and meet the people we had been praying for.

Dee Rebba took us on a tour of the compound and to be honest, looking at the accommodation with western eyes, it seemed grim and I came away from the tour with a heavy heart. The smiling faces of these beautiful children and their easy-going, friendly manner seemed to be at odds with the dark, almost oppressive buildings they call home.



It wasn't until we heard some of their background stories and visited the surrounding villages, which the kids had come from, that the joy and peace of the lovely kids at IREF made sense.

These children are fed, watered, and clothed. They are given a roof over their heads and protection. They thrive on the company and support of hundreds of other children with similar stories to their own. Not only do they find love and strength in

this family of children, but they are introduced to a heavenly Father who loves them wholly and unconditionally. They are schooled and trained up, giving them the hope and potential to break the cycle of abject poverty when they reach adulthood themselves.

Dee and Emmanuel work tirelessly for these children and young people, and I was impressed on a daily basis by their energy, compassion, and vision. But I worry how much longer they can carry on at such a pace.
