

Seizing the moment

I am sure many of you are wondering how IREF is faring in the midst of India’s lockdown. The answer is that, in typical fashion, IREF(India) has seized the initiative to make the most of the unique opportunity that the lockdown has presented them with!

*Be very careful, then, how you live—
not as unwise but as wise

On Thursday 19th March, the Central Government of Andhra Pradesh closed all schools, requiring children in boarding schools to return home. Within a few hours, nearly all of IREF’s students had left for their home villages. The following week, India’s Prime Minister announced a 21-day Lockdown for the entire country.

But here are some examples of how IREF(India) has seized the opportunity to do good in these challenging days.

God’s love in action

Because of limited access to markets and increased curfews - some daytime ones as well as night-time ones - shopping for basic daily food items (such as milk, vegetables, and fruit) became very difficult for almost everyone in rural India; most rural villagers depend on fresh produce, as they don’t have fridges and freezers (or even cupboards) to store perishable items, which can deteriorate very quickly in the intense heat of an Indian summer.

So IREF decided to be bold in seizing the moment by offering aid packages to those in greatest need. Maintaining strict rules of social distancing and donning face masks, IREF’s leadership prepared and distributed packages of rice and vegetables (mostly) to IREF’s non-teaching staff and some surrounding neighbours, several of whom are IREF church members, in its first wave of relief work.



IREF has often offered much-needed humanitarian aid in times of floods, fires, natural disaster, and other emergency situations – and the coronavirus pandemic certainly falls in this category. The local Public Works Commissioners approached IREF, knowing of its community work in helping others during emergency situations.

Although the number of Covid cases in rural India is low, sanitary workers in Repalle have been working tirelessly to keep the town safe and sanitised. Their activities include sewage maintenance, street sweeping, and other sanitary-related work. The workers are mostly from lower-caste communities and low social-economic backgrounds; they work extremely hard, yet have next to nothing materially.

Whilst everyone else is being encouraged to stay indoors, they keep working hard outdoors in often blistering heat. They strive to keep each town clean, healthy, and safe for everyone else.

IREF recognised the sanitary workers for their sterling work by distributing 250 food packages composed of rice, cooking ingredients, and fresh vegetables.
