


Sad losses

For many months, Repalle managed to remain free from the Covid-19 virus. But eventually, the potentially deadly disease arrived.

Many IREF staff members have been exposed to the virus and have needed to quarantine in their own homes.

So it came as a terrible shock to learn that on 24th July, IREF's Elementary and High School Principal, Mr. Zachariah, had passed away due to the effects of the virus. Unfortunately, his symptoms were not diagnosed until it was too late to save him. Zachariah had been with IREF for three years and was making a positive impact on many students' lives. He was being sponsored by one of our UK supporters.



Zachariah was known and is remembered by IREF staff and students as a humble and mild-mannered man, who shared the Gospel of Christ through his actions and deeds. He will be greatly missed by all who knew him.

Please remember his wife and 21-year old son in your prayers as they grieve this sudden and tragic loss. As the whole IREF community comes to terms with the loss of a dear friend and a vital member of their staff, please uphold them all through your prayers.

Later, on 10th October, we received the very sad news that Emmanuel Rebba's youngest brother, John Daniel, had also succumbed to the virus. He had been suffering from a fever for two days and was struggling for breath. He tested positive for Covid, and passed away within a few hours; he was only 55 years old.


Pastors Conference

Since March, the main method of evangelism has been IREF's Sunday services, broadcast on the Telegu Christian TV Channel.

Facemasks, sanitisers, and temperature checks were all put in place to ensure the safety of the 120 delegates attending the conference.

Three Nursing College students also attended the conference. Finding faith, coming home

Last year, a man arrived at IREF asking to meet with Emmanuel Rebba. He was a former pupil of IREF's school and had returned to request baptism.

Three years ago, Nageswarao had obtained a job in West Bengal working for the Indian government. During his time there, he had met a man who was a Christian. As Nageswarao talked to the Christian, he remembered some of the things he had been taught through IREF as a child. The Holy Spirit worked in Nageswarao's life to lead him to commit himself to Jesus Christ as his Lord and Saviour.

When his new Christian friend encouraged him to be baptised, Nageswarao headed for Repalle. He travelled 13 hours by train and car to be baptised by IREF saying, "This is where God started everything."



When Nageswarao walked out into the River Krishna River to be baptized, Emmanuel said it was time to change his Hindu name (which represented Lord Shiva, the god of snakes) for a Christian one, to symbolise him leaving his old life behind, buried in the waters of the Krishna. Nageswarao declared his faith in Jesus by being baptised and coming up out of the water as 'David - a man after God's own heart!'

The sponsorship Nageswarao received as a child laid the foundation for the faith he later embraced as an adult. Every sponsor is investing in God's kingdom in far-reaching ways we may never fully realise. Praise God for his faithfulness in bringing seeds to fruition!
